<p><b>Assistance to Bidders</b></p> <p>(a) Any queries relating to the tender document and the terms and conditions contained therein should be addressed to the Tender Inviting Authority for a tender or the relevant contact person indicated in the tender.</p> <p>(b) Any queries relating to the process of online bid submission or queries relating to CPP Portal in general may be directed to the 24*7 CPP Portal Helpdesk.</p>	<p><b>Assistance to Bidders</b></p> <p>(a) Any queries relating to the tender document and the terms and conditions contained therein should be addressed to the Tender Inviting Authority for a tender or the relevant contact person indicated in the tender.</p> <p>(b) Any queries relating to the process of online bid submission or queries relating to CPP Portal in general may be directed to the 24*7 CPP Portal Helpdesk.</p> <p>*Eligible Bidders [Class-I Local Supplier or class (II) local supplier as the case may be in the procurement as per rule 153 (iii) of GFR-2017 and public procurement (preference to make in India) order-2017 dated 4th June 2020.</p> <p><b>LOCAL SUPPLIER</b></p> <p>1. ‘Class – 1 Local Supplier’ means a supplier or service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement has local content equal to or more than 50% as defined under Order No. P-45021/2/2017-PP(BE-II) dated 04-06-2020 issued by Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (Public Procurement Section), Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Govt of India.</p> <p>a. ‘Local Content’ means the amount of value added in India which shall unless and otherwise prescribed by the nodal ministry, be the total value of the item procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (including all domestic duties) as a proportion of the total value, in percent.</p> <p>b. For the purpose of verification of ‘Local Content’, the Class-1 Local Supplier / Service Provider at the time of bidding, tender or solicitation shall be required to indicate percentage of local content and provide self-certification that the items offered meet the local content requirement for Class – 1 Local Supplier. They shall also give details of the location(s) at which the local value addition is made.</p> <p>c. In cases of procurement for a value in excess of 10 crore, the Class – 1 Local Supplier shall be required to provide a certificate from the statutory auditor or cost auditor of the company (in case of the companies) or from a practicing cost accountant or practicing chartered accountant (in respect of suppliers other than companies) giving the percentage of local content.</p> <p>d. Nodal Ministries may constitute committees with internal and external experts for independent verification of self-certifications and auditor’s / accountant’s certificates on random basis and in the case of complaints.</p> <p>e. False declarations will be in breach of Code of Integrity under rule 175(1)(i)(h) of the General Financial Rules for which a bidder or its successors can be debarred for upto two years as per Rule 151 (iii) of the General Financial Rules along with such other actions as may be permissible under law.</p>
